Last Time Out

The No. 23 University of the District of Columbia women's basketball team suffered a 78-60 loss in its season finale Saturday at C.W. Post.

"You've got to give C.W. Post credit – they played an excellent game today," head coach Lester Butler, Jr. said. "They wanted the game a little more than us today. We had a chance to claim a share of the regular season title, and we just didn't play our best basketball."

The Firebirds, who were outrebounded 49-38 and allowed 21 second-chance points, fell to 21-5 overall and 12-4 in league play to end the regular season.

C.W. Post, which shot 49-percent from the field and outscored UDC 44-30 in the second half, improved to 20-8 overall and 11-5 in the ECC.

Senior forward Dohnay Banice led three Firebird scorers in double-figures with 15 points and eight rebounds. Guards Lauren Brittingham and Ty Abilla also scored 11 points apiece. Brittingham also handed out a season-high nine assists.

Scouting STAC

The pre-season ECC favorite Spartans come into Saturday's game with an overall record of 17-10 and a league mark of 11-5. They have had quite a tumultuous season, losing their first six games only to bounce back by winning seven straight. This season, STAC has beaten NE-10 power Southern Connecticut, as well as each of the remaining three other teams in the tournament. The Spartans turn the ball over the least of the four remaining teams, have the 2nd best scoring defense in the league (55.0 ppg) and are tops in the league in FT shooting pct. (72.6).

Brittingham Surpasses 1,000 Career Points

During UDC's 54-44 victory over STAC on Jan. 28, Lauren Brittingham surpassed the 1,000 point career scoring plateau. She is the third 1,000-point scorer at UDC under head coach Lester Butler.

Winning Ingredients

This season, UDC is 18-0 when leading at halftime, 18-0 when they score over 60 points, 16-0 when they shoot a higher FG percentage than their opponent, and 13-0 when they out-rebound their opponent.

New Kids on the Block

In their first year as members of the ECC, the Firebirds have already made quite an impression. They finished the season 2nd in the standings, and they have beaten every team in the conference (besides Dowling) at least once. During the regular season, they swept NYIT, Queens, Mercy, Bridgeport and Molloy.

Brittingham and Rich Both Reach 100 Assists

Lauren Brittingham and Jasmine Rich currently rank 2nd and 5th in the ECC in assists per-game. Brittingham has 118 assists this season and Jasmine Rich has 100.

Bests in the Business

Senior forward Dohnay Banice leads the conference in field goal percentage (57.7) and ranks 5th in the league in rebounding (7.8 rpg).

Also, senior guard Lauren Brittingham ranks 6th in three-point FG pct. (35.0), 6th in FT pct. (80.5), and 7th in scoring (13.6 ppg).

Firebirds 12th in Nation for Steals Per-Game

The Firebirds currently rank No. 16 in Division II with a 12.8 steals per-game average. (As of Feb. 27) Six different players have 30 or more steals as the team has combined for 332 thefts thus far.

Racking Up ECC Weekly Honors

UDC's Janelle Junior, Jamilia Bonner, Lauren Brittingham, and Dohnay Banice have each earned East Coast Conference player of the week honors this season. Banice was the most recent Firebird to be selected, as she was honored on Mon., Jan. 23. Also, this past Monday, Feb. 20, Denikka Brent earned her second ECC rookie of the week.

UDC Picked 6th in ECC Pre-Season Coaches Poll

University of the District of Columbia, an inaugural member of the conference, was picked sixth in the East Coast Conference in the preseason coaches' poll announced October 28, 2011 by the conference office. The poll was voted on by the league's nine head coaches.

St. Thomas Aquinas garnered 75 points and five first-place nods to top the list. C.W. Post, the reigning ECC champion, was second with 67 points and two first-place votes. Dowling (61), Bridgeport (54) and Molloy 47) rounded out the top-five. UDC came in next with 35 points, followed by NYIT, Queens and Mercy.
